


# School cuts



## Lobby of Parliament

**24 October 2017**

Shortfalls in funding mean 88% of schools are still facing real-terms cuts despite Government announcements about more money going into the system. So we still face:

- less for our children and young people
- bigger classes
- fewer teachers and staff
- a reduced curriculum
- parents plugging the gaps.

# School funding is facing its biggest shortfall in a generation. As a result of pressure from unions, school staff and parents, the Government has moved £1.3bn into the schools budget.

But this is not new money; it is being raided from other parts of the education budget. Even worse, it doesn't come close to reversing the £2.8bn in cuts that schools and academies have suffered since 2015.

- **88%** of schools will still face real-terms budget cuts.
- For the average primary school this is a loss of **£52,546** per year.
- For the average secondary school this is a loss of **£178,321** per year.

The Chancellor will be setting next year's budget in November – the time is now to put the pressure on.

## What can I do?
